The **Ontario Hockey Association (OHA)** was founded on November 27, 1890 and is the governing body for the majority of Junior and Senior hockey in the Province of Ontario. The OHA is a Member Partner of the **Ontario Hockey Federation** which is one of thirteen Provincial and Regional Branches of **Hockey Canada**.

It is comprised of three Junior hockey leagues and two Senior hockey leagues: **Junior A – Ontario Junior Hockey League; Junior B – Greater Ontario Hockey League; Junior C – Provincial Junior Hockey League, Senior – Allan Cup Hockey (AAA) and Ontario Elite Hockey League (AA)**. For the 2024-25 season, these five leagues encompass 132 teams.

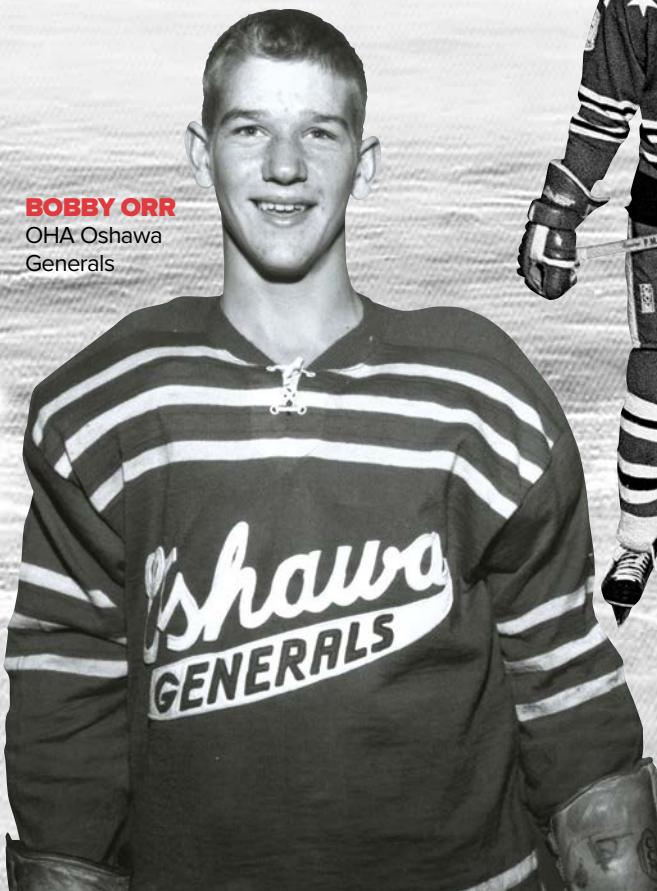

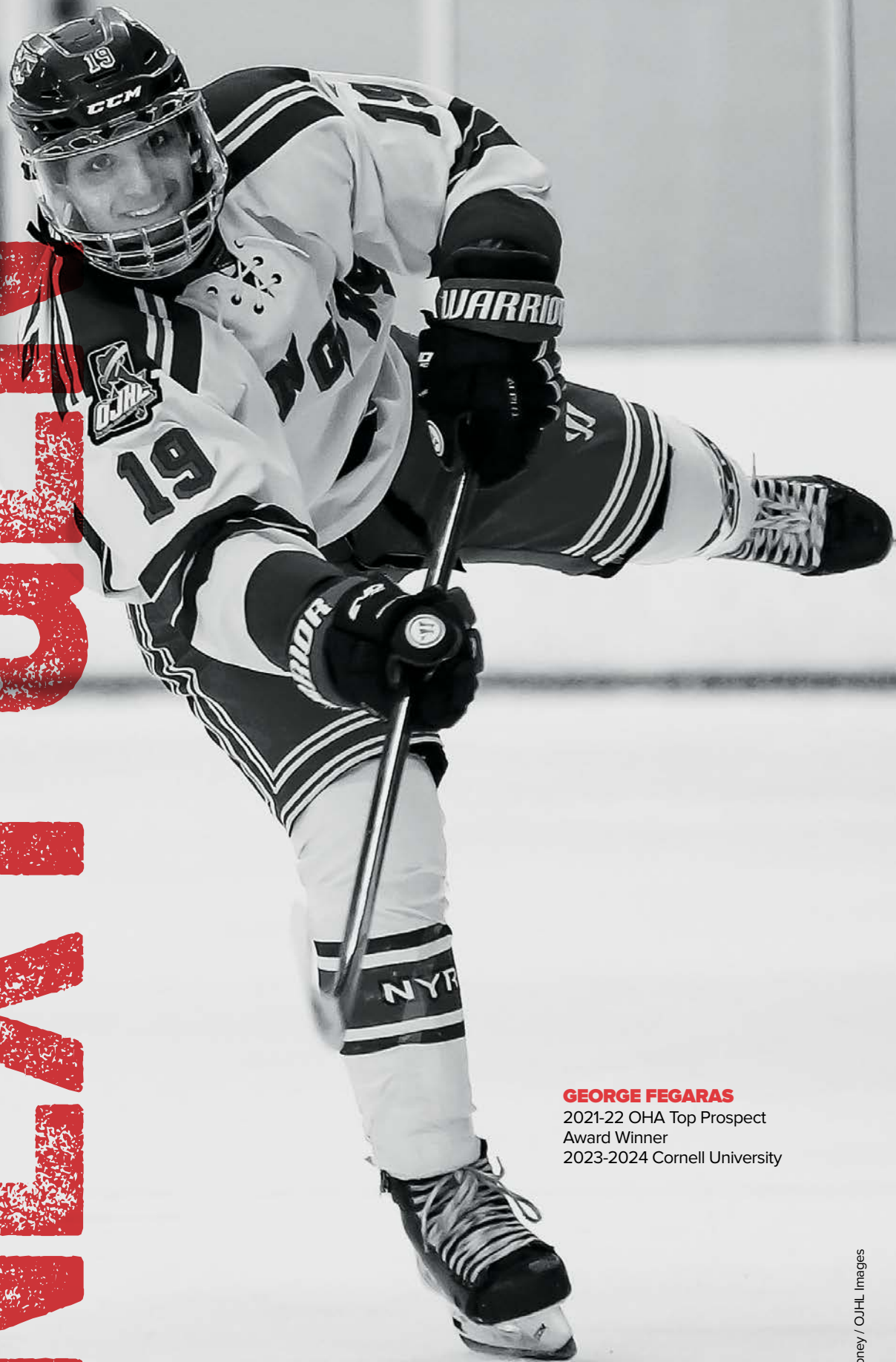

OHA MEMORIAL CUP

The OHA decided in its December 1918 meeting to establish a memorial to commemorate the fallen players. The result was the OHA Memorial Cup, which would be for Canada-wide competition among junior teams. The first championship was won by the University of Toronto Schools in 1919.

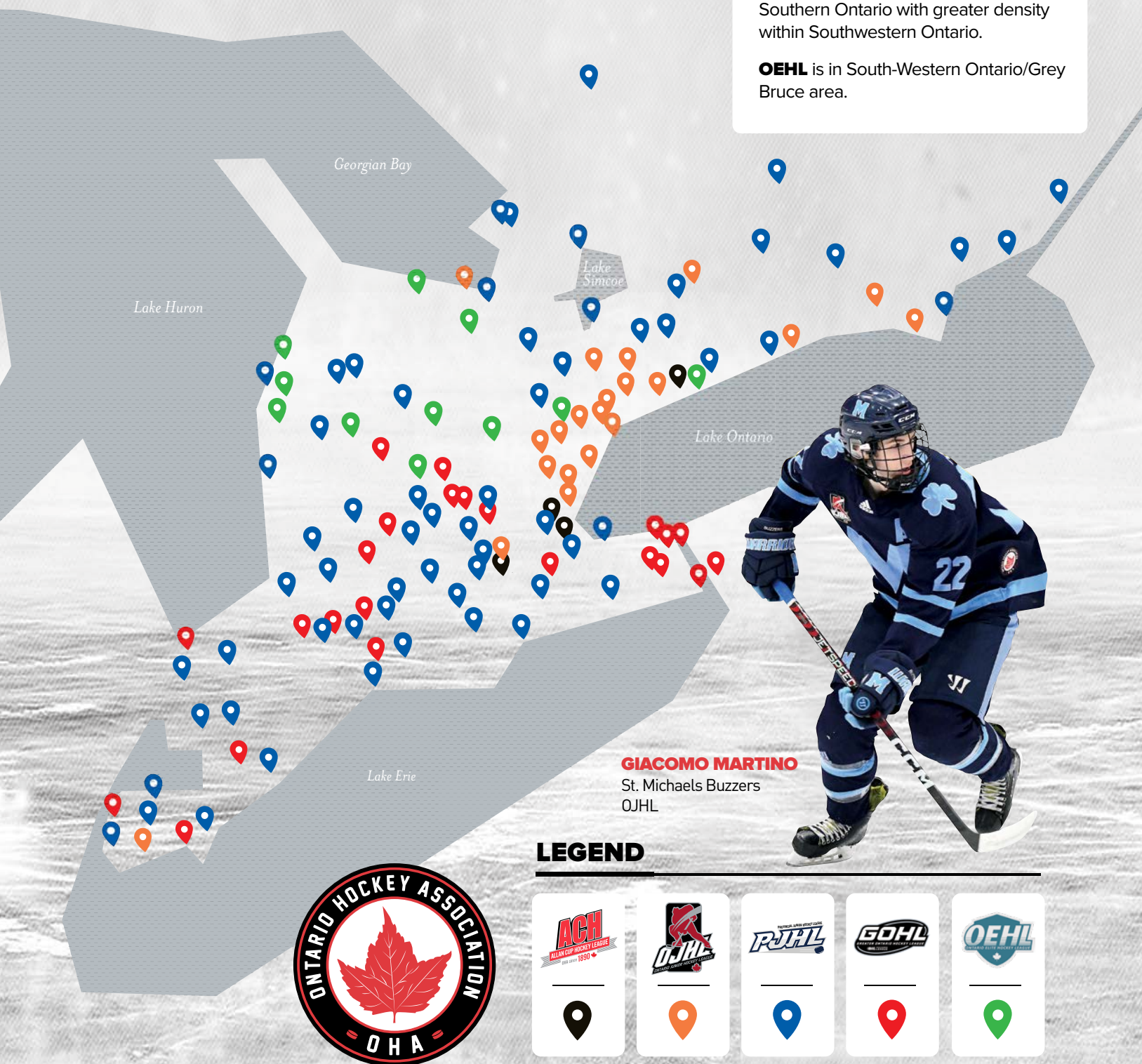
ACH is based around GTA-Hamilton-Golden Horseshoe area.
